The program will highlight examples of how women are redefining power and leadership—from creating bridges across Nigeria's Muslim/Christian conflict to making women's voices heard in the Egyptian revolution; from cultivating empathy in South Africa as a means of healing from apartheid to using economic power and "feminine values" to drive change; from working within the Catholic church to reform policies to asking a billion people to rise to end violence against women—participants will have an opportunity to join the conversation and explore "what's possible" in their own lives and communities.
