We value our progress in 2012, and are now eagerly moving forward with our governance shift that brings new energy into our organization and our programs," said Robert Lederer, the first executive director of the EICC.

Key milestones of 2012 noted in the report include the hiring of the EICC's first executive director, completion of the first full year for the Membership Compliance Program and progress on several programs on topics including working hours, conflict minerals, transparency, the UN Guiding Principles on Business & Human Rights and carbon and water use in operations. Also notable in 2012 was a collaborative roundtable event in Amsterdam with representatives from the EICC and member companies, civil society and trade union groups on worker rights.
