- its work on technology and innovation including hydrogen-based fuels, advanced biofuels and lower-carbon energy investments.

For the 10th consecutive year, an External Review Committee of sustainability experts has reviewed and assessed the report. Their assessment is included in the report.

The Global Reporting Initiative (GRI) has confirmed an A+ reporting level of its G3.1 Reporting Guidelines.
